 - Addressing student learning loss
 - Advocating to equity among the paraprofessional in relation to compensation
 - Thanks to Mrs. Story for the candy snack, it was much appreciated
 - Five Trustees are new to the Board and are trying to address deficiencies for the past decades, both
 with respect to staffing and facilities needs. The Board is receptive to listening and making
 changes.
 - Death threats made to the Board are made by cowards behind a keyboard, we must be kind to each other and civilized
 - Congratulations to the district sports teams
 - Kudos to starting sports at the middle school level
 - Welcome student representatives
 - Excellent presentation by students on World Language

Mr. Sanchez clarified that a mechanism to add assistant principals was rejected by the HASA group. He

Be It Further Resolved, that these matters will be made public when the need for confidentiality no longer exists.

Trustee Oates motioned to go into a second Executive Session at 10:55 p.m., seconded by Trustee Goodman, with all members present voting aye. The Trustees reconvened into public Session at 11:15 p.m
