VI. Finance

VII.1. Whereas, the Hackensack Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools and Interim School Business Administrator, adopted a 2020-2021 budget on March 23, 2020,

Whereas, the aforementioned budget was approved by the voters of Hackensack,

Whereas, in recognition of the emergency COVID-19 situation that greatly imperiled tax collections by the Treasury Department of the State of New Jersey and subsequently resulted in the need for the State of New Jersey to reduce the State Aid allocation to Hackensack Board of Education in the amount of \$2,731,555,

Whereas, in order to maintain a thorough and efficient (T&E) education, the New Jersey Department of Education permits Boards to amend their budgets as specified in N.J.S.A. 18a:22-8.1 and N.J.A.C. 6A23A-13.3 (b) and (c), by

1. Using unassigned general fund surplus from the 2019-2020 to maintain budgeted appropriations;
2. Or requesting Commissioner approval to withdraw from emergency reserve, or

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3. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.2(D), withdraw from maintenance reserve to cover budgeted required maintenance costs; or
4. Reduce appropriations for 2020-2021 or
5. A combination of 1, 2, 3, and 4 above

Whereas, each board of education must hold a public meeting to adopt a plan to address state aid reduction and submit a revised budget to the County office by August 14, 2020;

Now, Therefore Be it Resolved, that the Hackensack Board of Education, County of Bergen, used a combination of #1 and #4 shown above, approves and adopts the REVISED 2020/2021 School Year Budget as shown below:

VIII. Buildings Grounds

VIII.1 Be It Resolved, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools and Interim SBA/Board Secretary, ratifies the actions taken by the firm of Remington & Vernick Engineers, Inc. to oversee all facets of the emergency removal of the Middle School Field Underground Storage Tank, including all appropriate permits and closure filings with the appropriate State agencies), located at the Middle School field, at a cost of \$16,000.

VIII.2 Be It Resolved, by the Hackensack Public Schools, and upon the recommendation of the Superintendent and Interim SBA/Board Secretary, to accept the following changes to the scope of work to the Middle School Turf field as described below. These adjustments will be taken from the allowance of \$25,000, which is built into the contract:

- PCO#1 Ball-Stopper Netting (\$6,250.00): Provide 80' of 10' high netting over the top of the regular fence along Passaic Ave.
- PCO#2 Not approved - replace concrete sidewalk at a cost of \$16,900.00.
- PCO#3 Extend Turf (\$12,380.00): Remove existing asphalt walkway and extend artificial turf to the fence line. All gates to remain.
- PCO#4 Credit for 165' of Existing Fence (-\$6,250.00): Keep existing fence along the walkway on South West side of the field

VIII.3 Be It Resolved, by the Hackensack Public Schools, and upon the recommendation of the Superintendent and Interim SBA/Board Secretary, to authorize the firm of Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc, 96 U.S. Highway 206, Suite 101, Flanders, NJ, 07836, to provide all phases of professional architectural services to the Hackensack Board of Education for improvements to the High School Tennis Court Replacement and Resurfacing including preparation of all related documents, amendment to the Long Range Facilities Plan and submittal for review to the New Jersey Department of Education for

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review and approval of a "school facilities capital project" at a cost of \$49,000, which includes construction administration, as detailed in their proposal dated May 21, 2020.
