Whereas, under N.J.S.A. 18A: 7F-9, if a school district is subject to a health-related closure for a period longer than three consecutive school days, a subject to a health-related closure for a period longer than three consecutive school days, a jointure commission shall continue to make payments under the terms of a contract with a contracted service provider as if the school facilities remained open, and

Whereas, if there are health-related school closures, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9, the SBJC will be obligated to continue payments to its transportation service providers during the 2024-2025 school year; and to continue payment to those

Whereas, SBJC's commitment contracted transportation service providers is contingent upon the Board's continued payment to SBJC; and

Whereas, the SBJC is desirous of amending the terms of the Agreement to memorialize the Board's responsibility to continue its payment obligations to the SBJC in the event of school closures due to health-related

reasons to ensure full compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.

Now, Wherefore, The Parties Agree as follows:

- 1. For the term of the 2024-2025 school year, if schools are closed and/or operating under virtual or remote instruction as a result of the current public health emergency, thereby not requiring transportation services for the Board's students, the Board shall continue to make payments under its Agreement with SBJC, as if the school facilities remained open, for SBJC to pay its contracted transportation service providers in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.
- 2. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement not addressed herein shall remain in full force and effect.
