What is Title I?

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Rurpose of Title I

- Federal funding to districts/schools to help students who are low achieving or most at-risk of falling behind.
- To help every child receive a high quality education and to achieve the high standards set by the state of New Jersey.

Goals of Title I



- □ Increase student academic achievement
- Reprovide instructional support to neediest academic students

Targeted Assistance

- Cargeted assistance programs use funds for supplemental educational services only for identified students who meet criteria determined by the school. These identified students have the greatest need for additional support.
- Œ Eligible students can be any student in the school (e.g. special education, English Language Learners, etc.) and they do not have to receive free or reduced lunch to be eligible.
