Students who do not complete the assignment by the due date or who are new to the Hackensack School District will be required to read and use a short text (assigned by their language arts teacher) to complete the Summer Reading Assignment.

ASSIGNMENT: READING FICTION

(a “made-up” story with characters, setting, and plot details)

Choose a fictional novel that is grade-level appropriate and not a novel that you have previously read. The novel can be historical, realistic, science, or mystery fiction. While reading, take notes about the **main character** and about the novel’s biggest **conflict**. After reading, you will use your notes and understanding of the book to complete two graphic organizers.

Main Character:

The main character is also called the protagonist and is the central or most important character in a story around whom plot events are focused. The main character usually undergoes a change as a result of the events in the story.

- While reading, jot notes about the character by asking yourself these questions:
 - *What does the character look like?*
 - *What is the character feeling?*
 - *What is the character thinking?*
 - *How does the character act?*
 - *How does the character act towards other characters?*



Tip: How to Take Notes

State the chapter and the characters involved. Include page numbers.

Example:

Chapter 1

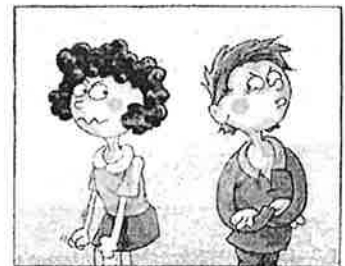
page 2 - Douglas is 13 years old, tall for his age, and his family says he’s cute

page 6 - Douglas seems like he’s worried about starting at a new school.

Conflict:

Authors incorporate different types of **conflicts** in their stories. These **conflicts** drive the action and create suspense in the novel. Conflicts can be internal (character vs. self) or external (character vs. character, character vs. society, character vs. nature, character vs. technology, character vs. the supernatural, etc.). An internal conflict occurs when a character feels two opposite emotions or desires. An external conflict occurs when a character struggles against an outside force that prevents him or her from being happy.

- While reading, jot notes about the conflict by asking yourself these questions:
 - What is the problem?
 - Who is involved in this conflict?
 - How is the main character handling the conflict?
 - Was he or she successful? Why or why not?

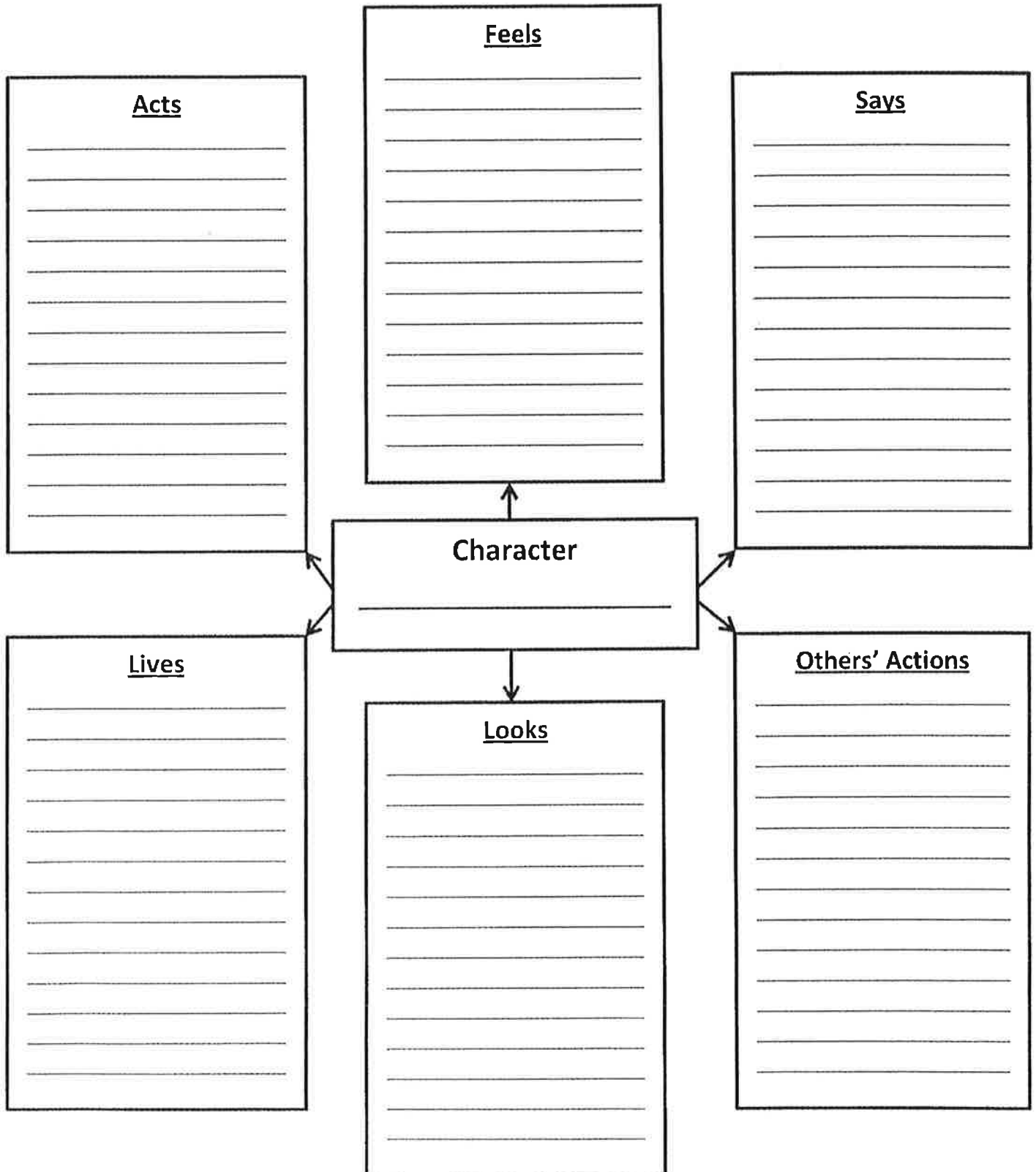
